## POST-DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP IN THE EPIDEMIOLOGY OF AGING AND DISABILITY YALE SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

The <u>Center on Disability and Disabling Disorders</u> at Yale University offers a 2-year postdoctoral fellowship in the Epidemiology of Aging and Disability. This experience provides fellows with the opportunity to address fundamental issues related to the epidemiology and prevention of disability among older persons; train with mentors who are experts in the epidemiology of disability; and produce high impact research papers that will help them establish a successful research career.

The Center, under the leadership of <u>Dr. Thomas Gill</u>, conducts longitudinal studies and clinical trials to enhance the scientific knowledge base of the disablement process in older persons and to rigorously evaluate promising intervention strategies. The Center works closely with the superb Resource Cores of the Yale Program on Aging (Biostatistics and Operations) and has access to data from several large NIH-sponsored studies, including (among others) the <u>Precipitating Events Project (PEP Study)</u> and <u>National Health</u> and Aging Trends Study (NHATS). Current NIH-funded research is focusing intently on distressing symptoms, functional outcomes, serious health events such as major surgery, end of life, disadvantaged older populations, and health disparities.

Ample training opportunities are available through the <u>Yale Program on</u> <u>Aging/Pepper Center</u>, <u>Investigative Medicine Program</u>, and <u>School of</u> <u>Public Health</u>. Suitable candidates should have a PhD or an MD, prior training in epidemiology, demography, biostatistics, or a related field, and strong communication skills. Expertise in statistical programming, including SAS, is highly desirable.

Stipends are commensurate with experience. Although not required, US citizenship or permanent residence is preferred. Candidates from diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.
